Reading

Engage in conversations about stories.

Learn new vocabulary

Develop their phonological awareness, so that they can: -spot and suggest rhymes

- count or clap syllables in a word

-recognise words with the same initial sound, such as money and mother

Read individual letters by saying the sounds for them

Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words. Our Topic

is

Writing

Use some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing. For example, writing 'm' for mummy.

Write some letters accurately.

Write own name.

The Colour





Myself- During this topic the children will be discussing themselves and their families. They will understand that God knows and loves us all.

Welcome – The children will be looking at Baptism. They will understand this is a welcome to God's family and will recognise some signs and symbols of a Baptism.



Link numerals and amounts: e.g. showing the right number of objects to match the numeral, up to 5

Develop fast recognition of up to 5 objects.

Maths

Talk about and explore 2D and 3D shapes using vocabulary such as 'sides', 'corners'; 'straight', 'flat', 'round'.

Make comparisons between objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity.

Copy and create repeating patterns.

Communication & Language

Understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important.

Listen carefully to rhymes and songs, paying attention to how they sound.

Engage in story times. Learn rhymes, poems and songs.

Hold conversation when engaged in back-and-forth exchanges with their teacher and peers.

Use talk to help work out problems and organise thinking and activities, and explain how things work and why they might happen.

Talk about members of their immediate family and community.

Understand the effect of changing seasons on the natural world around them (Autumn to Winter).

Explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings.

Return to and build on their previous learning, refining ideas and developing their ability to represent them.
