Children have 5 steps to success to achieve this:


1.Listen with respect



Our Curriculum

In Year 1, learning transitions from learning through play to more structured learning. Children begin to develop stronger Maths and English skills while still engaging in creative and practical learning opportunities. Our aim is to build confidence, independence and curiosity to support the development of key learning skills.

Information about our curriculum and the topics covered in class will be put on the website half termly about the curriculum in each class.



Our Curriculum

In Year 1, our foundation topics are:

Autumn 1 - The Local Area Autumn 2 - Trains

> Spring 1 - The UK Spring 2 - Toys

Summer 1 - All about Me Summer 2 - The Seaside

Maths

We want your child to become confident and assured mathematicians who see Maths in the whole world. Our Maths lessons in school enable children to think and use their Maths every day.

In Year 1, we have 2 sessions of Maths each day:

Formal Maths lesson: Abacus curriculum (currently consolidating numbers to 20)

Mastering Number (Mini Maths): Supporting consolidation of early maths skills and fluency.

English

In school, we are using the Jane Considine scheme of writing to create incredible authors!

In Year 1, pupils transition from Early Years Writing format into the Jane Considine scheme in Spring 1 term.

This half term, we look closely at a range of Year 1 texts and begin implementing elements of The Write Stuff scheme incrementally.





Phonics


At the end of Year 1, it is a government requirement that pupils complete a Phonics Screening Check.

As part of this, pupils will read a series of 40 real and nonsense words to check phonetic understanding. The pass mark is currently 32/40.

In school, we follow the Read, Write, Inc Scheme of Phonics. Pupils access daily small group phonics sessions at their appropriate level and reading books will be sent home weekly to support progress at home.







School Trips

This year we have three exciting trips booked for Year 1:

-Autumn Term: George Stephenson's Rocket Workshop

-Spring Term: Beamish Museum

-Summer Term: A day at the Beach

To support the pupils in attending these trips, we are asking that parents pay a set fee of £30 for the whole school year.

Payments are to be made via Arbor and can be payed in £5 installments over the coming months or, as a one-off payment. If you need any support with Arbor payment, please talk to one of the members of staff in the school office.

Dates are TBC and payment will be set up this week, I will send an Arbor message to let you know when payment is live.

Thursday - Gymnastics (Class)


Please can all pupils come into school wearing full PE kit on these days. Any earrings are to be removed at home.

Reading Books:

Books are changed and pupils are read with on a weekly basis. In the coming weeks, pupils will begin coming home with 2 books:

1 book will be a 'Book Bag' book that complements their Phonics book of that week and 1 book will be a previously read Phonics book that pupils should be confident in reading to develop fluency and comprehension.

Please read both books at home each week and leave a comment in their Reading Record so we can monitor this closely in class.
