## Behaviour

## Important class notices: Year 4 homework

### Reading Homework

Children who are on the reading scheme will have their books changed on a **weekly** basis. Please listen to them read at home, and we will continue to listen to them in school. Books should be in school every day, even if they do not need changing. Children have separate days for book changing, so please make sure that they have been read at home and signed by that day – they will be changed and handed back out by the end of that day where possible. Children are encouraged to use Reading Eggs for 20 minutes each week.

### Spelling Homework

Spellings will be taught on a Thursday, and then these spellings will be tested on the following Thursday. We will learn words from the Year 3/4 curriculum. Please talk to your children about their spellings – both the sounds/letters in the words and the meaning of the words.

### Maths Homework

Maths homework will be set on a **Thursday** and expected to be completed by the following **Thursday**. These activities will be used to consolidate the learning taking place in class. It will generally be set on MyMaths, but occasionally a sheet may also be sent home.

Year 4 take part in the National Multiplication Test in June. With this in mind, children are expected to use TTRS at least two or three times a week for approximately 15 mins.

### Other important notices

PE days this half term in Year 4 are on a Tuesday and Wednesday. Please ensure your child have correct PE kits and ideally remove any earrings before school.

## Our school day

In Year 4, children will enter through the Main gate between **8:40am** and **8:50am**, and are to be collected at **3:10pm**. Please ensure children arrive and are picked up promptly. If they have siblings, they will collect them from their classrooms (if their siblings are younger) or wait to be collected (if the siblings are older).
