## Sara's Super Saturday

On Sunday 31st May, we celebrated Pentecost – when the disciples received the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is sometimes called a 'helper', and in the assembly for the w/c June 1st, children watched a video about a girl who received help. Here is a version of that story, called 'Sara's Super Saturday':

Grandad asked again, "Do you know what time it is, Sara?"

Sara couldn't tell the time, tie her shoelaces or ride her bike without

stabilisers, but with help she learned how to be like others and do the things they do – just like the Holy Spirit helps us to be like Jesus and do the things He does! Children learned that like the way Sara's family helped her, the Holy Spirit is welcoming, peaceful, forgiving, encouraging, loving and kind: whenever we demonstrate those qualities, we can be sure the Holy Spirit is working in us.
